Then, he moved to The University of Texas at Dallas as the Cecil H. and Ida Green Distinguished Chair Professor in Department of Biological Sciences and the director of Center for Systems Biology. He was a guest professor of Tsinghua University (2003-2021), a visiting chair professor of HKU (2010-2016) and a visiting scholar of Fudan U (2023-now).
