Francisco Rowe is a Professor in Population Data Science and the Lead of the Geographic Data Science Lab at the University of Liverpool. He is also the Co-Chair of the Mobile Phone Data Task Team at the UN Committee of Experts on Big Data and Data Science for Official Statistics (UN-CEBD) and the Lead of the Migration Sub-group. His research focuses on human mobility and migration; geographic data science; and spatial inequalities. It seeks to advance our understanding of the causes and impacts of human movements for communities and individuals through the novel application of geographic data science methodologies and digital footprint data. His recent work has focused on changes to human mobility patterns during disasters, including climate, health hazards and conflict, and how urban form shapes mobility patterns and impacts climate. Francisco works closely with various sections of the UN, including the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean, the International Organization for Migration and the Statistics Division.
