Biography

Dr. Zohar Lederman is a Clinical Practitioner in the Department of Emergency Medicine and a Research Fellow in the Centre for Medical Ethics and Law, The University of Hong Kong. He is also an emergency medicine physician with a PhD in bioethics from the National University of Singapore and formal undergraduate training in the humanities with a focus on philosophy. He started his medical career as a volunteer emergency medical technician in Israel. He then finished medical school in Italy, internships in both Italy and Israel, and an emergency medicine residency at a level 1 trauma centre in Israel.

Dr. Lederman's research interests include Ethics of Emergency Medicine, Ethics and Justice of Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation, Clinical Ethics, Ethics of Loneliness, Empirical and Theoretical Research into Loneliness in Hong Kong and Globally, Social Emergency Medicine, Public Health Ethics, Environmental Ethics, One Health Ethics, Just War Theory, Ethics of Slow Codes, War in Gaza.

His work has been published in the top bioethics journals including the *Journal of Medical Ethics*, *Bioethics*, and *Public Health Ethics*.
