She received her PhD and MA in Political Science from the University of Michigan and a BSSc in Government and Public Administration from the Chinese University of Hong Kong.

Her research in international/comparative political economy seeks to understand the political consequences of two of the most important changes in the contemporary world economy — technological change and the rise of China. Her work is currently supported by the Canadian Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC) and the Canadian Institute for Advanced Research (CIFAR) through the Azrieli Global Scholars Program.
