Notes for New Social Sciences Students

I am pleased to welcome you to the Faculty of Social Sciences. I hope you will find the coming years both intellectually stimulating and academically rewarding.

Registration Documents

The dates for completing the registration and course selection formalities are set out in document SS14/725, which also includes information of major events in this academic year.

Regulations and Syllabuses

After reviewing all the details concerning registration and University regulations, your next crucial step is to select courses you wish to study in the upcoming year. The available courses and regulations governing course selection are stated in the “Regulations for First Degree Curricula” at <https://calendar.hku.hk/> and the “Regulations and Syllabuses” at <https://www.socsc.hku.hk/reg>.

Course Selection

The first semester of the 2025-2026 academic year begins on Monday, September 1, 2025. You are expected to attend lectures, tutorials, etc. from that day onwards. Please visit the departmental website(s) from which you have selected your courses and pay attention to the emails sent from these departments, as they will provide further details with regard to course timetables, books to be used and so on. You should also check the locations of lecture theatres and tutorial rooms in advance, and/or Moodle links for teaching materials/sessions, as appropriate.

The course selection period for the 2025-2026 academic year is **from 10:00am, August 19 to 4:00pm, August 25, 2025**. You are required to complete the course selection for the whole academic year via the HKU Portal.

If for any reason that you subsequently wish to make changes to your course selection, you may do so during the first and second weeks of the semester [i.e. **from 10:00am, September 1 to 4:00pm, September 15, 2025 for the first semester**]. This should be done through the HKU Portal during the course add/drop period.

Some courses are offered twice a year. When selecting courses online, you are required to indicate the exact semester and sub-class you wish to enrol in. Please note that your preferred sub-class may be subject to change to ensure a better distribution of students. You are advised to check your course selection status online via HKU Portal before the semester begins.

In planning your studies, you should also note that, in addition to lectures, courses may consist of tutorials, seminars, exercise classes, or laboratory work. Information on these will be provided by

the respective departments at the beginning of the semester. These sessions may meet at any time during the week, provided that they do not clash with the lecture hours. Attendance is obligatory.

Fulfilment of Graduation Requirements under Regulations for First Degree Curricula

According to the graduation requirements prescribed in UG5 of the Regulations for First Degree Curricula, students are required to successfully complete the following courses:

Exemption of CAES1001

Students who obtained the following qualifications are exempted from the requirement 1b as stated above, and Academic Communication in English (CAES1001) is optional:

- i) achieved Level 5 or above in the English Language paper in the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination (HKDSE)
- ii) holder of Bachelor's degree from an English-medium university
- iii) achieved Grade A or above in English Language at GCSE/ GCEO / English First Language at IGCSE / English Second Language at IGCSE
- iv) achieved Grade A or above in English Language GCE Advanced Level (AL)/ Advanced Subsidiary Level (ASL)
- v) achieved an overall IELTS score of no less than 7 AND with all sub-scores no less than 6.5 on the Reading, Speaking, Listening and Writing Tests
- vi) achieved an overall TOEFL Internet-based test score of no less than 94 AND no less than a 24 on the writing, a 20 on the speaking, a 20 on the listening, AND a 19 on the reading sections
- vii) achieved in International Baccalaureate (IB) Grade 4 or above in HL English Language A: Language and Literature / HL English Language A: Literature / HL English Language (B Syllabus) / HL English Language (A1 or A2 Syllabus); or Grade 5 or above in SL English Language A: Language and Literature / SL English Language A: Literature / SL English Language (B Syllabus) / SL English Language (A1 or A2 Syllabus)
- viii) achieved Grade 4 or above on the Advanced Placement (AP) English Language / English Language and Composition / English Literature and Composition Test
- ix) achieved a section score of 630 or better in Reading and Writing of the NEW Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) in the same attempt
- x) achieved Level C2 in Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English / Grade A in Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English
- xi) achieved a score of 76 in the Pearson Test of English Assessment (Academic)
- xii) achieved Grade B or above in H1 General Paper at the Singapore GCE A-level
- xiii) achieved Grade A or better in English language at Malaysia SPM examination
- xiv) achieved Grade A2 or better in Malaysia UEC-Senior English Language
- xv) attained Level 4 in each set of credits in New Zealand NCEA Literacy (10 credits made up of 5 credits in reading and 5 credits in writing)
- xvi) achieved a score of 95% or better in English at All India Senior School Certificate Examination / Higher School Certificate
- xvii) achieved a final score of 90% or better in English at Grade 12 Canadian high school curriculum
- xviii) achieved Grade B or better in English Language at Sri Lanka Ordinary examination
- xix) achieved a score of 90 or better in English in the Russian Unified State Exam (Единый государственный экзамен, ЕГЭ, Yediniy gosudarstvenniy ekzamen, EGE)

The exemption shall be granted automatically to eligible students based on the academic results provided for admission. The record of exemption for CAES1001 will be reflected on the Degree Audit Report in Student Information System (SIS) starting from **August 11, 2025**.

For students who have satisfied the eligibility criteria but do not see the exemption record, please submit an online application to the Faculty Office via the link at <https://www.socsc.hku.hk/webforms2/aceexemption> **on or before 2:00pm, September 11, 2025.**

For non-HKDSE students who have not taken any of the abovementioned admission exams, you can apply for exemption by sitting for the Academic Speaking and Writing Test conducted by the Centre for Applied English Studies scheduled for **August 25, 2025.** Please submit your application to the Faculty Office via the link at <https://www.socsc.hku.hk/webforms2/aceexemption> **on or before 2:00pm, August 19, 2025.**

Exemption of Chinese language enhancement course

Students are required to take one of the following courses in the second semester of Year II to fulfil the Chinese language enhancement requirement:

- CSSC9001 “Practical Chinese for Social Sciences Students” or
- CUND9001 “Basic Spoken and Written Cantonese for Mandarin Speakers” (for Putonghua Speaking Students) or
- CUND9002 “Practical Chinese and Hong Kong Society” (for Putonghua Speaking Students) or
- CUND9003 “Cantonese for non-Cantonese Speaking Students” (for Putonghua Speaking Students) or
- CUND9004 “Practical Applied Chinese Writing and Effective Presentation Skills for Non-local Mandarin Speaking Students” (for Putonghua-speaking students)

Students who did not study the Chinese language during their secondary education and have not reached the required proficiency level for the Chinese language enhancement course specified for the degree curriculum may take one of the following courses in either Chinese language or Chinese culture in lieu:

- CHIN9501 “Chinese as a Foreign Language I” or
- CHIN9511 “Cantonese as a Foreign Language I” or
- CHIN9521 “The Fundamentals of Chinese Characters” or
- CHIN9522 “Exploration of Major Cultural Themes across Chinese History”.

Such students are required to submit an application for exemption to the Faculty Office via the link at <https://www.socsc.hku.hk/webforms2/chiexemption> **on or before September 30, 2025.**

Academic Advising

Students will each have a Faculty Academic Adviser (FAA) and Faculty Student Adviser(s) (FSA(s)) to assist them in adjusting to the university studies as well as the registration and course enrolment process. You are required to sign up for your FAA and FSA(s) during the period **from 2:00pm, August 11, 2025 to 10:00am, August 19, 2025** at <https://ugaa.hku.hk/signup-faa.php>. If you do not sign up by August 19, 2025, the System will randomly assign FAA and FSA(s) to you. All students are strongly encouraged to meet with their assigned FAA and FSA(s) at least once per semester during the first year to discuss various academic issues and learning experiences.
