Siqu Han is an assistant professor of sociology at the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK), where she is also involved with the computational social science cluster. Before joining CUHK, she was a postdoctoral researcher at Columbia University. She completed her PhD at the Ohio State University. Her research focuses on the structure of knowledge within college curricula, the interplay between field of study and school-to-work transitions, and the economic returns of skills in the labour market. Utilizing a mix of surveys and unstructured textual data, Siqu employs advanced quantitative methods, particularly machine learning and LLM-based data collection, to tackle fundamental questions regarding social stratification. She finds joy in defining complex concepts and measuring them with quantitative rigor. Recent updates to her work include exploring skill diversity at job level, economic returns to curriculum interdisciplinarity, deservingness described in college crowdfunding campaigns, and national gender egalitarian progress in relation to women's overeducation. These papers appeared in *American Journal of Sociology*, *PNAS*, *European Sociological Review*, *Journal of Marriage and Family*, *Social Science Research*, *Research in Social Stratification and Mobility*, among others.
