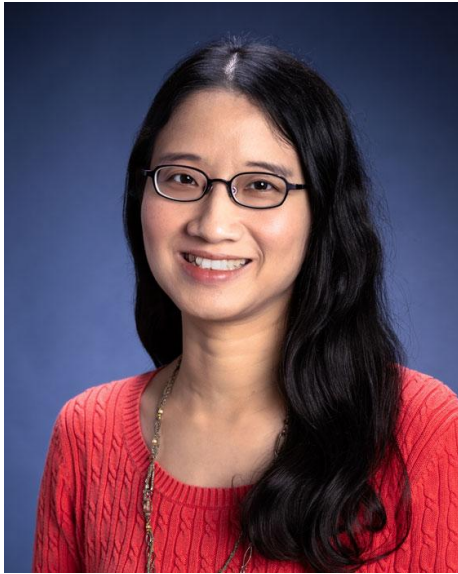




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Florrie Fei-Yin Ng is Professor and Chairperson of the Department of Educational Psychology and Associate Director of the Brain and Mind Institute at The Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK). She received her Ph.D. in developmental psychology from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and completed her postdoctoral training at New York University and the City University of New York Graduate Center. Her research focuses on understanding the role of parents in child development from infancy through adolescence and the factors that shape parenting. She is particularly interested in how cultural and socioeconomic contexts may shape parents' beliefs and practices and thereby contribute to children's academic and socioemotional functioning over time. Ng's work has been published in leading journals, including *Child Development Perspectives*, *Child Development*, and *Developmental Psychology*. She also served as an Associate Editor of *Child Development*. Her contributions to research and teaching have been recognised with the Young Researcher Award, the Research Excellence Award, and Vice-Chancellor's Exemplary Teaching Award at CUHK. Her research has been featured in overseas and local media, including Al Jazeera English, the American Broadcasting Company, the British Broadcasting Company, and the New York Times.
