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Hideo Akabayashi is Professor of Economics at Keio University. His research focuses on the economics of education and family economics. His work includes theoretical research on child development and parental interactions, as well as empirical studies on the effects of class size, private high school voucher programs, and school ICT resources in Japan. He is the principal investigator of the Japan Child Panel Survey (JCPS), the first longitudinal survey in Japan to collect information on both cognitive and non-cognitive skills of children, which was launched in 2010 as a supplement to the Japan Household Panel Survey (JHPS) at Keio University. To advance these diverse research activities, he has also served since 2017 as Director of the Center for Research on Equality of Opportunity for Children (CREOC) at Keio University. His recent research includes laboratory and field experiments with children conducted in both in-person and online settings. He is also the founder and CEO of gacom.jp, a web directory of Japanese schools comparable to GreatSchools.org in the United States. Before joining Keio University, he served as a Japanese government official and worked as a consultant at the World Bank.
