Sho Fujihara is a Professor at the Center for Social Research and Data Archives, Institute of Social Science, The University of Tokyo. He received his Ph.D. in Sociology from Osaka University in 2010. His research interests include social mobility, with a particular focus on the roles of education, occupational scales, and social survey methodology. He also works on the collection and use of occupational data, including the development of automated coding systems and probabilistic methods for scale construction. His current project on automated occupational coding and probabilistic measurement is supported by the JSPS Grant-in-Aid for Specially Promoted Research (2023–2029). His work has been published in the *European Sociological Review*, *Social Science Research*, *Socius*, and *Research in Social Stratification and Mobility*, among others. He is a board member of the International Sociological Association Research Committee 28 on Social Stratification and Mobility (RC28) and a co-PI of the 2025 SSM (Social Stratification and Social Mobility) Survey Project.
