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Yuying Tong joined The Chinese University of Hong Kong as an Assistant Professor in 2008 and was promoted to full Professor in 2020. She serves as the Director/Co-Director of the Centre for Chinese Family Studies (CCFS) and as Associate Dean (Research) in the Faculty of Social Sciences. Her research areas span social demography, migration and immigration, family and life course, gender, and population health and well-being. Her current research interests focus on two aspects. In migration research, she primarily studies how migration creates and redistributes inequality across individuals and households in multiple domains, and how migrants and households respond to it. In family studies, she currently focuses on the determinants of family changes and their consequences in East Asian societies. Yuying Tong's research has been published in leading journals in both Sociology and Demography. She has received the CUHK Research Excellence Award and the Research Mentorship Award. Currently, she serves as the Deputy Editor for the Journal of Marriage and Family and Associate Editor for Social Science Research.
